This model has proven effective in ensuring the accuracy of service plans and other functional documents, keeping caregivers engaged in the "bigger picture" and embracing a greater responsibility, providing the resident's loved ones with greater trust and confidence, enhancing the knowledge and performance of facility managers, fostering a marketing advantage and reducing surveillance citations. Communication truly is everything when it comes to coordinating care for our residents. Employing this model of caregiving in your facility will assist you in ensuring that your residents remain healthy, happy, and safe!
